Trail Review by Jayne Hesley

Park: Rancho Cañada del Oro Open Space Preserve, 4289 Casa Loma Rd, Morgan Hill, CA 95037

Trail: Longwall Canyon – Bald Peaks Loop

Distance: 7.6 miles

Elevation: 800feet

Park at the (free!) Rancho Canada del Oro equestrian lot which easily accommodates 6-7 trailers with unloading onto gravel. There is a horse drinking bowl with an old-timey pump. If the lot is full, continue up Casa Loma Road a few hundred yards where there's a large overflow lot on the left.

The route: Cross the road and head out Longwall Canyon Trail which is quite flat for at least the first mile and it has a small creek to cross. Don't turn off and the trail will climb steadily but not too steeply with quite a bit of shade until you reach a scenic spot to stop and rest at a picnic table and water your horse. Here the trail becomes Bald Peaks Trail. There are a few stretches where you're out in the sun for a while and it can be hot in the summer. You are now looping back to the East and will remain on Bald Peaks Trail (actually in Calero Park here) until you see the sign for Little Llagas Creek Trail which is a nice single track with areas lined by trees that takes you far above Casa Loma Road and right back to the trailhead at the parking lot. Poison oak? Some, but not too bad and not reaching over the trail when I've gone. Footing? There are a few areas that are a bit rocky at the West end of Longwall and maybe the ridge part of Bald Peaks. I'd say it's generally fine for barefoot horses.

Shortcuts? Needlegrass and Catamount Trails will cut the route but they are both quite steep.

I would give this ride a 4 out of 5 stars but it's difficult to get a 5 star rating out of me.

Skillman Horse Camp

The Jack Brook camping trip scheduled for July has been cancelled. We were joining Monterey Bay Equestrians for this event but they have organized a great alternative in the Sierra foothills. You must be a member of SMHA or MBE to participate. Sign up through the eventbrite link at the bottom of this email.

Join the Monterey Bay Equestrians at Skillman Horse Camp in the Tahoe National Forest. It's absolutely beautiful. Great trails, nice shaded campgrounds with bathrooms, horse water, etc. Very easy drive to get there. You will need to bring your own panels or there are plenty of trees to hi-tie. This will be a catered campout. Camping space is limited so make your reservations soon.

July 10-14, 2020

\$200 per person includes 4 nights camping and all meals (11 meals) beginning with dinner Friday night to breakfast Tuesday morning.



HORSE RIDING IN A TIME OF COVID-19

On trail: give each other *at least 6 feet at all times*

- Give people space. That means in parking lots or other gathering areas, but it also means on the trail.
- Respect any trail or facility closures. (And remember, have a backup plan before you leave, in case you arrive to find an area closed or crowded.)

- Be extra cautious. **Emergency responders are very busy.** Please don't take any risks that might mean you need rescue or health care.
- Wash your hands or use hand sanitizer before you eat, and avoid sharing water bottles or snacks.
- **Pack out your trash and any toilet paper.** That means taking it home with you. This is always our advice but it will take all of us doing a little extra to keep our trails in good shape right now.

The following is open at the park:

Very limited parking is now available to the public. Once the park has reached its safe parking capacity, the park will be closed to vehicle entry.

I was there on Sunday morning, arrived at 10:30am and the lot was almost full. I found a spot in the center which is supposed to be for trailer parking where I could pull through. I was adjacent to cars, but had a one car gap on one side of the trailer.

GO SOLO OR WITH YOUR FAMILY UNIT

- Going outdoors is for your physical and mental health, not for socializing.
- Stay 6 feet away from people you do not live with. Yield to others and maintain a safe distance.
- Choose less frequented parks and trails. Check park agency websites for recommendations.
- Do not park in a crowded parking lot or use a crowded trail.
- **Do not hold social or family gatherings at parks (i.e., picnics).**

STAY CLOSE TO HOME AND AVOID CROWDS

- Look for nearby nature to enjoy in your own neighborhood; this is a time to rediscover your neighborhood.
- Some parking lots are closed; don't drive and you'll get more exercise.
- Visit nature virtually; there are many options online.

STAY SAFE AND HEALTHY

- Do not visit parks, or areas in a park, that have been closed.
- Many restrooms and facilities are closed; plan ahead before leaving home.
- Shorten your visit to give others the opportunity for a safe experience.
- Stay home if you or someone in your household are sick.
- Leave no trace. Garbage collection is limited; pack out what you pack in.
