



Big Basin Facilities Management Plan Online Survey

Big Basin Redwoods State Park is an iconic landscape that hosts rich natural and cultural resources, recreational opportunities, and cherished memories for many Californians. California State Parks celebrates all the ways in which the local community, partners, and the broader public want to get involved in the recovery and reimagination of the park after all park facilities were lost in the 2020 CZU Fire.

Big Basin Survey

This survey will collect ideas about park visitor experiences and preferences that will be considered in the development of the Facilities Management Plan. The main survey is a series of simple multiple-choice questions and is designed to take about 5 minutes. All answers will be anonymous.

OPTIONAL: The second part is optional and is an interactive virtual experience with more creative and open-end survey questions. This part can take 15-20 minutes and is optional.


